# USDF/ Great American Sport Horse Breed Show

## Saturday Aug 1, 2009

### **Young Horse/Sport Horse Classes (\$35.00 per class - Class 524 - 525 no fee)**

*To be shown in hand at the walk and trot on the triangle. Judged for suitability to become dressage horses. To be scored 60% movement, 30% conformation, 10% general impression. Bridles are mandatory for horses two years old and older.*

- 517. **Yearling Fillies** (born in 2008)
- 518. **Yearling Colts and Geldings** (born in 2008)
- 519. **Two-year-old Fillies** (born in 2007)
- 520. **Two-year-old Colts and Geldings** (born in 2007)
- 521. **Three-year-old Fillies** (born in 2006)
- 522. **Three-year-old Colts and Geldings** (born in 2006)
- 523. **2009** Colts, with or without dam, foal only to be judged
- 523f. **2009** Fillies, with or without dam, foal only to be judged
- 524. **Filly Championship** - first two places from Classes 517, 519, 521, 523f (USDFBC qualifier)
- 525. **Colt Championship** - first two places from Classes 518, 520, 522, 523 (USDFBC qualifier)

### **Handler Class (\$25.00)**

526. **Amateur/Junior/Young Rider Handler** - To be shown in hand on the triangle by an Amateur, Junior or Young Rider. Handlers must be at least 14 years of age. To be judged on presentation of the horse to the judge, neatness and appearance of the handler, and overall condition of the horse. Conformation will not be a determining factor and may not count more than 15%.

### **Mature Horse/Breeding Classes (\$35.00 per class - Class 533 - 534 no fee)**

*To be shown in hand at the walk and trot on the triangle. Judged for suitability to produce dressage horses. To be scored 50% movement, 40% conformation, 10% general impression. Unsoundness may be penalized at the judges' discretion.*

- 529. **Four-year-old and older Mare** with or without foals. (mares only to be judged)
- 530. **Four-year-old and older Maiden or Yeld Mares** (not nursing or currently in foal)
- 531. **Four & Five year-old Stallions**
- 532. **Six-year-old and older Stallions**
- 533. **Mare Championship** - first two places from classes 529 & 530 (USDFBC qualifier)
- 534. **Stallion Championship** - first two places from classes 531 & 532 (USDFBC qualifier)

### **Materiale Classes (\$35.00 per class)**

Horses will be evaluated according to the criteria listed on the "USDF Dressage Sport Horse Prospects Under Saddle" Score sheets. Horses will first be evaluated under saddle at the walk, trot and canter in both directions of the arena. No more than six horses will be asked to canter at one time. Four and five year old horses may be asked to lengthen the stride at the trot and canter. The judge determines the order and method in which the horses are presented for in-hand evaluation. Horses must be a least 36 months of age to participate in Materiale Classes

- 538. **Four and Five Year Old Mares**
- 539. **Four and Five Year Old Colts and Geldings**

## **RULES AND GENERAL INFORMATION**

1. Dressage in the Rockies I, II & III are covered by the rules and specifications of the current US Equestrian Rule Book and will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith.
2. Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Preliminary Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A nonmember may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$30 nonmember registration fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions. 8) Opportunity classes, 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.
3. **CONDITIONS OF ENTRY:** Every horse entered for competition will be under the control of the Horse Show Management, but the Horse Show Management, Dressage in the Rockies and High Prairie Farms will, in no case, be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur, and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the Horse Show and its Directors harmless for any loss or accident of his horse, horses or equipment which may occur from sickness, fire or otherwise.
4. **ENTRY ACCEPTANCE: PLEASE READ CAREFULLY: ALL ENTRIES RECEIVED BEFORE THE CLOSING DATE WILL BE ACCEPTED.** Entries Received after the closing date may be put on a waiting list if show is full, those on a waiting list not getting into the show will have all fees refunded. NO PHONE entries will be accepted. All entries must be made on official entry blanks and filled out completely as to classes, exhibitors names, addresses, phone numbers, association numbers, and signatures. Express mail entries should check signature waiver. Entries for High Prairie Dressage and Dressage in the Rockies must be RECEIVED BY CLOSING DATE FOR EACH SHOW.
5. **MINOR EXHIBITORS:** No minor's entry will be accepted unless signed by a parent or legal guardian. An agent's signature will not be accepted on any minor's entry. Parents or guardians of minor exhibitors hold Dressage in the Rockies, High Prairie Farms, Inc., its directors, agents and employees harmless for injury to such minor.
6. **LATE ENTRIES** (Entries RECEIVED after the closing date will be considered a late entry): will be accepted and given a ride time only as schedule permits. Each late entry will be charged a late fee of \$50.00.
7. **TECHNICAL DELEGATE:** The Technical Delegate is available at all times during show hours for clarification of rules or to answer any questions and can arrange an appointment with a judge. Any exhibitor attempting to interfere with the judges in a way; or who by act of influence shall be guilty of conduct unbecoming an exhibitor, shall forfeit all paid fees and be excluded from further competitions. No one shall approach a judge regarding a decision unless first obtaining the permission of the Technical Delegate. Also, equipment will be spot-checked at the discretion of the Technical Delegate.
8. **SCRATCHES:** Exhibitors have the responsibility of informing the Show Office of their intention to scratch. NO SHOWS WILL BE BILLED \$10.00 PER CLASS. Scratches before the closing date may be made for any reason and all fees will be refunded except the office fee. Scratches after the closing date and up until the scratch date of Friday, July 24, 2009 for Dressage in the Rockies will be accepted with a veterinarians excuse for a 50% refund. **THERE ARE NO REFUNDS FOR ANY REASON AFTER May 29.**
9. **ARENAS:** 20 x 60 arenas of composition footing. Only horses entered in the show will be allowed in warm-up area. No one on foot is allowed in designated warm-ups. Lunging is to be done ONLY in specified areas. All horses in the warm-up areas must wear their competition numbers.
10. **STABLING:** Permanent stalls are 10' x 12' with full doors. NO FIRST BEDDING PROVIDED but may be ordered prior to the show by calling 303-841-3892. NO HORSES MAY ARRIVE ON THE GROUNDS BEFORE TUESDAY. Cost for stalls are \$135.00 Thursday through Sunday, \$110.00 Friday through Sunday, \$95.00 Saturday and Sunday and \$55.00 for a day stall.
11. **RIBBONS AND AWARDS:** Ribbons to 5th place, prize or money for 1st place depending on the class entered. Prize money will be paid within ten days after the competition to the owner of the horse. Prize money will be paid as follows: 1st 30%, 2nd 25%, 3rd 20%, 4th 15% and 5th 10%. Prize money will only be awarded to scores of 60% and above in the Freestyles and 58% and above in all other classes.

**12. RIDING TIMES:** Unofficial Times will be mailed to all exhibitors prior to the show, and will be available on our website at [www.cornerstonedressage.com](http://www.cornerstonedressage.com), OFFICIAL TIMES WILL BE POSTED EVERY MORNING ONE HOUR BEFORE THE FIRST SCHEDULED RIDE. IT IS THE RESPONSIBILITY OF EACH COMPETITOR TO CHECK THE OFFICIAL TIMES DAILY. Adequate time intervals cannot be guaranteed when riders enter more than one horse in any class. If you enter classes in different levels or divisions, there may be considerable time between rides.

**13. RIDERS:** Riders may show only 2 horses in any one class, unless special permission is granted from management.

**14. MANAGEMENT:** Horse Show Management reserves the right itself to interpret all questions and conditions in regard to or arising out of any incident in the show without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. All questions not covered in these rules and regulations shall be decided by the Horse Show Management; their decision will be final. The Horse Show Management reserves itself the right to refuse, accept conditionally, or to cancel any entries, disqualify riders or exhibitors, prohibit exhibition of entries and cancel award prizes, without claim to damages; to change, cancel or combine any classes, to reschedule classes after due notice to exhibitors, or to change rings or rotate judges.

**15. RV PARKING:** RV Hook ups are available for basic power and water use at \$35 per day. Colordao Horse Park may charge a higher daily rate for additional power use (such as air conditioners, washing machines, etc.) Wastewater disposal is not available on the show grounds.

**16. VEHICLES:** Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals in accordance with Rule 6. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

**17. MEDICAL WASTE:** In accordance with the rules of USEF Bio-Hazardous Medical Waste containers are provided in the stable area. All exhibitors and their agents are responsible for the proper disposal of this waste.

**18. GOLF CART RENTAL:** Golf carts are available by advance reservation only call 303-744-3494. They are available at \$175.00 for the week. They require a \$250.00 damage deposit which will be returned to you at the end of the show if the cart is returned clean and in good condition.
