## Entry Agreement

By entering this Competition and signing this entry blank as the Owner, Lessee, Trainer, Manager, Agent, Coach, Driver, Rider, Handler, Vaultler or Longeur and on behalf of myself and my principals, representatives, employees and agents, I agree that I am subject to the Rules of USEF, California Dressage Society and the local rules of the Competition. I agree to release and hold harmless the competition, CDS, their officials, directors and employees for any action taken under the Rules. I represent that I am eligible to enter and/or participate under the Rules, and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered.

I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, USEF and/or the Competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, and/or broadcasts, internet, film, new media or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the competition, coverage or benefit of the competition, sport, or the Federation. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation.

### Release, Assumption of Risk, Waiver, and Indemnification This document waives important legal rights. Read it carefully before signing.

I AGREE in consideration for my participation in this Competition \_\_\_\_\_ to the following:

I AGREE that CDS and the "Competition" as used herein includes the Competition Management, as well as all of their officials, officers, directors, employees, agents, personnel, volunteers and Federation affiliates.

I AGREE that I choose to participate voluntarily in the Competition with my horse, as a rider, lessee, owner, agent, trainer, or as parent or guardian of a junior exhibitor. I am fully aware and acknowledge that horse sports and the Competition involve inherent dangerous risks of accident, loss, and serious bodily injury including broken bones, head injuries, trauma, pain, suffering, or death.

I AGREE to hold harmless and release USEF, CDS, Los Angeles Equestrian Center, Cornerstone Event Management and the Competition from all claims for money damages or otherwise for any Harm to me or my horse and for any Harm of any nature caused by me or my horse to others, even if the Harm arises or results, directly or indirectly, from the negligence of the Federation or the Competition.

I AGREE to expressly assume all risks of Harm to me or my horse, including Harm resulting from the negligence of the Federation or the Competition.

I AGREE to indemnify (that is, to pay any losses, damages, or costs incurred by) the Federation and the Competition and to hold them harmless with respect to claims for Harm to me or my horse, and for claims made by others for any Harm caused by me or my horse while at the Competition. I have read the Federation Rules about protective equipment, including GRS01 and, if applicable, EV 114, and I understand that I am entitled to wear protective equipment without penalty, and I acknowledge that the Federation strongly encourages me to do so while WARNING that no protective equipment can guard against all injuries. If I am a parent or guardian of a junior exhibitor, I consent to the child's participation and AGREE to all of the above provisions and AGREE to assume all of the obligations of this Release on the child's behalf. I represent that I have the requisite training, coaching and abilities to safely compete in this competition.

# RULES AND GENERAL INFORMATION

- 1. Cool August Nights II** is covered by the rules and specifications of the current US Equestrian Rule Book and will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith.
- 2. Amateurs, Juniors & Young Riders:** Amateurs are defined by the rules and specifications of the current USEF Rule Book. *If an Amateur rider is planning on competing at the CDS Championship show they will be required to have an USEF Amateur card.* Jr/ YR rider classes are offered to anyone 21 and under (may compete until the end of the calendar year in which they turn 21) Young Riders are eligible for FEI YR classes from 16-21 years of age.
- 3. CONDITIONS OF ENTRY:** Every horse entered for competition will be under the control of the Horse Show Management, but the Horse Show Management will, in no case, be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur, and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the Horse Show and its Directors harmless for any loss or accident to his horse, horses or equipment which may occur from sickness, fire or otherwise.
- 4. ENTRY PROCEDURES: PLEASE READ CAREFULLY!!**
  - A.** Please submit completed and signed entry form. Include copies of your membership/horse registration cards, proof of Freestyle score eligibility (if entered in a freestyle) along with all fees. Entries without membership cards will be charged a \$20 internet search fee for membership. Incomplete entries may be charged a Late Fee. **SEND ALL FEES OR CC INFORMATION WITH ENTRY.**
  - B. Entry Acceptance:** Entries will be accepted on a first come-first serve basis until classes are filled. Entries received after classes are filled will be notified and, if desired, put on a waiting list. Those on a waiting list not getting into the show will have all fees refunded. NO PHONE entries will be accepted. All entries must be made **on official entry blanks and filled out completely as to classes, exhibitors names, addresses, phone numbers, association numbers, and signatures.** Parents or guardians must sign the official entry blank of a minor before a number will be released. **Changes made after entries are received will be charged a \$20 Fee**  
**Entries close and MUST BE RECEIVED BY Wed, August 14, 2024!! NO Entry will be processed without FULL payment!!!**
- 5. LATE ENTRIES:** All entries must be **RECEIVED** on or before the closing date or will be considered a late entry. Each late entry will be charged a late fee of \$75.00. Late entries will be accepted and given a ride time only as schedule permits.
- 6. SCRATCHES/REFUNDS: REFUND REQUESTS MUST BE IN WRITING AND SIGNED (EMAIL IS ACCEPTABLE).** Refunds for cancellations made prior to the entry closing date will be made in full less the office fee. No refunds will be given after the closing date for any reason, including acts of God, natural disasters, severe weather etc.  
**Refund of USDF Qualifying Fees:** Scratches prior to show in which a full refund (less office fee) is being made WILL include any USDF Qualifying fees paid. Scratches that do NOT qualify for a full refund will NOT be refunded any USDF Qualifying Fees. Non-refunded USDF Qualifying Fees will be paid to USDF per USDF rules.
- 7. UNPAID CHARGES:** Any exhibitor leaving the show with an unpaid balance of entry fees or feed bill, will be billed for these charges and a \$35.00 billing fee will be added to the total due. Until these charges are settled, all future entries of rider and owner will be returned.
- 8. RETURNED CHECKS:** Checks returned by the bank or declined credit cards will be assessed a 10% penalty (minimum \$50.00)
- 9. (GR902.1): EVERY CLASS OFFERED HEREIN WHICH IS COVERED BY THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE CURRENT USEF RULEBOOK WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGED IN ACCORDANCE THEREWITH.**
- 10. TESTS: The Current USEF FEI and FEI YR tests will be used.**
- 11. RIDING TIMES:** Preliminary ride times will be mailed and final ride times will be put on the website at [www.cornerstonedressage.com](http://www.cornerstonedressage.com) by 5:00 pm the day before the show for all exhibitors - Ride times will also be available at the showgrounds at 5:00 pm the day before the ride is scheduled. Adequate time intervals cannot be guaranteed when riders enter more than one horse in any class. If you enter classes in different levels or divisions ie. Open - Amateur or junior , there may be a considerable time between rides. It is the responsibility of the rider to inform the management of any time conflicts at least 24 hours before the scheduled rides. Any changes after the show starts will be charged a \$15.00 office fee.



## RULES AND GENERAL INFORMATION *continued*

**12. ARENAS:** 20 x 60 competition arenas of composition and sand footing– warm up arena has same type footing. Lunning has packed sand footing. Only horses entered in the show will be allowed in warm-up area. No one on foot is allowed in designated warm-ups. Lungeing is to be done ONLY in specified areas. All horses in the warm-up arenas must wear their competition numbers. All arena must be vacated while equipment is being used.

**13. RIBBONS AND AWARDS:** In classes where three or more riders complete the class, the winner will receive an award. If less than three, ribbons only will be given. Ribbons are awarded to fifth place

**14. MANAGEMENT:** Horse Show Management reserves the right to itself to interpret all questions and conditions in regard to or arising out of any incident in the show without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. All questions not covered in these rules and regulations shall be decided by the Horse Show Management; their decision will be final. The Horse Show Management reserves itself the right to refuse, accept conditionally, or to cancel any entries, disqualify riders or exhibitors, prohibit exhibition of entries and cancel award prizes, without claim to damages; to change, cancel or combine any classes, to reschedule classes after due notice to exhibitors, or to change rings or rotate judges.

**15. FEED AND BEDDING AT LAEC:** Feed orders must be made by 12:00 pm for next day delivery. Order forms to be sent to Meaghan Mallory @mmdressage@gmail.com. Forms will be available at [www.cornerstonedressage.com](http://www.cornerstonedressage.com).

**16. HOSE/ WASHING:** Do not wash horses in barn area-Please use the wash racks.We recommend you have a garden hose available.

**17. STALL CLEANING:**Please deposit all manure at the far end of the barn aisles.

**18. STABLING:** NO STRAW IS PERMITTED-ONLY SHAVINGS FOR BEDDING. NO FIRST BEDDING is provided, but may be ordered prior to the show. Stalls are of wood construction, 10' X 10" and canvas with dutch doors. Stalls are 60.00 for one overnight stay, i.e. if coming in Saturday for Saturday comp only, leaving Sunday morning = 1 overnight (\$60.00). Choose stabling for this competition only. **All stalls must be vacated by 11:00 a.m. on departure day.**

**19. SCHOOLING HORSES:** Horses not entered in the show must be registered with the Horse show office and will be given a number to be worn at all times outside of the stall. Appropriate office fee, stall or ground fees, drug fees and a **\$65 Per show day schooling fee** must be paid. Any person(s) riding a schooling horse must have signed an official entry blank and/or release form. No school horses are allowed in the warm-up area during the competition.Schooling horses scratched after closing date will be charged the \$55.00 office fee.

**20. DOGS:** Dogs must be on a leash at all times, even in the Barn area. Stray dogs will be impounded and held for \$50 fine

**21. PARKING:** Parking is allowed in designated areas only. Violators improperly parked, including NO PARKING ZONES AND FIRE LANES, will be issued citations and/or towed from premises at the vehicle owner's expense. (U.S. Mun. Code - 80.71-4/ CA. Veh. Code 22658A)

**22. RV's : \$80 per day (includes full hookups). Contact Glenda McElroy for more information [glenda@glenroys.com](mailto:glenda@glenroys.com)(818) 841-3554**

**23. RAIN SCHEDULE:** In the event of rain, times will be rescheduled to accommodate as many rides as possible. If we cancel your class, your money for that class will be refunded - if you scratch a class that is rescheduled, you will be liable for all class fees.

**24. FREESTYLES: Musical Freestyles:** It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to get their music emailed to the announcer. Please include the rider/horse and class #. Send directly to **Regi Toscano** at [barootifulart@gmail.com](mailto:barootifulart@gmail.com) and a copy to the show secretary, **Meaghan Mallory** at [mmdressage@gmail.com](mailto:mmdressage@gmail.com). Freestyles riders may have a representative at the announcer's stand to tell the announcer when to start and stop the music. **A back-up CD, MP3 or WAV file is required at the show. No cell phones or zip drives.**

**25. MEDICAL WASTE/SHARPS CONTAINERS:** In accordance with the rules of USEF (GR1210.4 Bio-Hazardous Medical Waste containers are provided in the stable area. All exhibitors and their agents are responsible for the proper disposal of this waste.Competition Management may fine any individual up to \$100 for improper disposal of needles or other sharp disposable instruments.

**26. HEADGEAR RULE:** From the time horses are officially admitted to the competition grounds by competition management, anyone mounted on a horse at any time on the competition grounds including non-competing riders, riders on non-competing horses, and those competing in all classes and tests, including Para-Equestrian tests must wear protective headgear as defined by this rule and otherwise in compliance with GR801. Any rider violating this rule at any time must immediately be prohibited from further riding until such headgear is properly in place. Protective headgear is defined as a riding helmet which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. The harness must be secured and properly fitted.

**27. BITS AND BRIDLE CHECK: NEW DEC. 1, 2023: DR126 2.i.1-1a:** Exhibitors must present bridles and bits, if & when requested, to the technical delegate for inspections utilizing the method, timeframe (s), & location (s) identified by the competitions management with the agreement of the T.D. The methods must be communicated to the competitors prior to the start of the competition.

**RULES AND GENERAL INFORMATION continued**

**28. GOLF CARTS:** Minors who do not have a valid driver’s license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver’s license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver’s license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed “unsafe use” if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

**29. USEF EQUINE VACCINATION RULE:** Note the following will be followed: At Federation licensed competitions horses, more than 7 months of age, entering the grounds must be accompanied by documentation of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) vaccinations within six months prior to entering the stables. Horses not in compliance with this rule may be required to leave the competition grounds upon request by Competition Management. Documentation should consist of one of the following methods mentioned below. The frequency of vaccine administration should be per the vaccine 103 manufacturers’ or veterinarian’s recommendations. It is recommended that vaccines are administered by or under the direction of a veterinarian. In the case of vaccines administered by a veterinarian, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide documentation from the veterinarian on documenting that the horse in question received the vaccinations; name of the vaccines and date of vaccine administration. In the case of vaccines administered by a person other than a veterinarian, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide a receipt of the vaccine purchase which is signed by the owner, or agent with care, custody, and control of the horse; name, serial number and expiration date of the vaccine; and date of vaccine administration. In the case of a horse that is unable to receive either of the vaccinations due to a history of adverse reactions, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide a letter from the veterinarian on official letter-head stating that the horse in question cannot be vaccinated due to medical concerns and a log of temperatures taken twice daily for the seven days prior to entering the competition grounds. These horses must also have their temperature taken and logged twice daily while on the competition grounds. The log of temperatures should be provided to the Competition Management, steward, or technical delegate when requested.

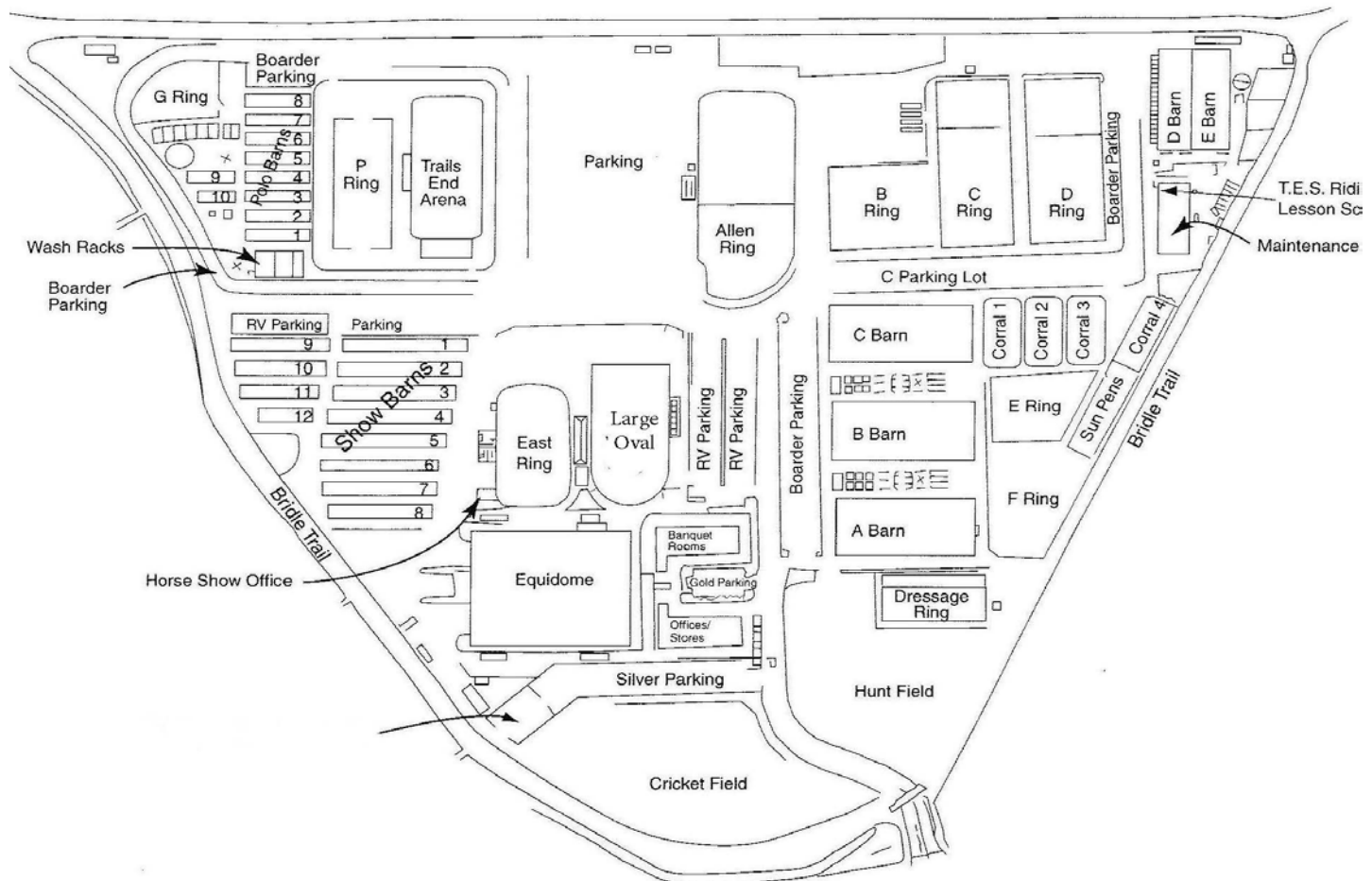
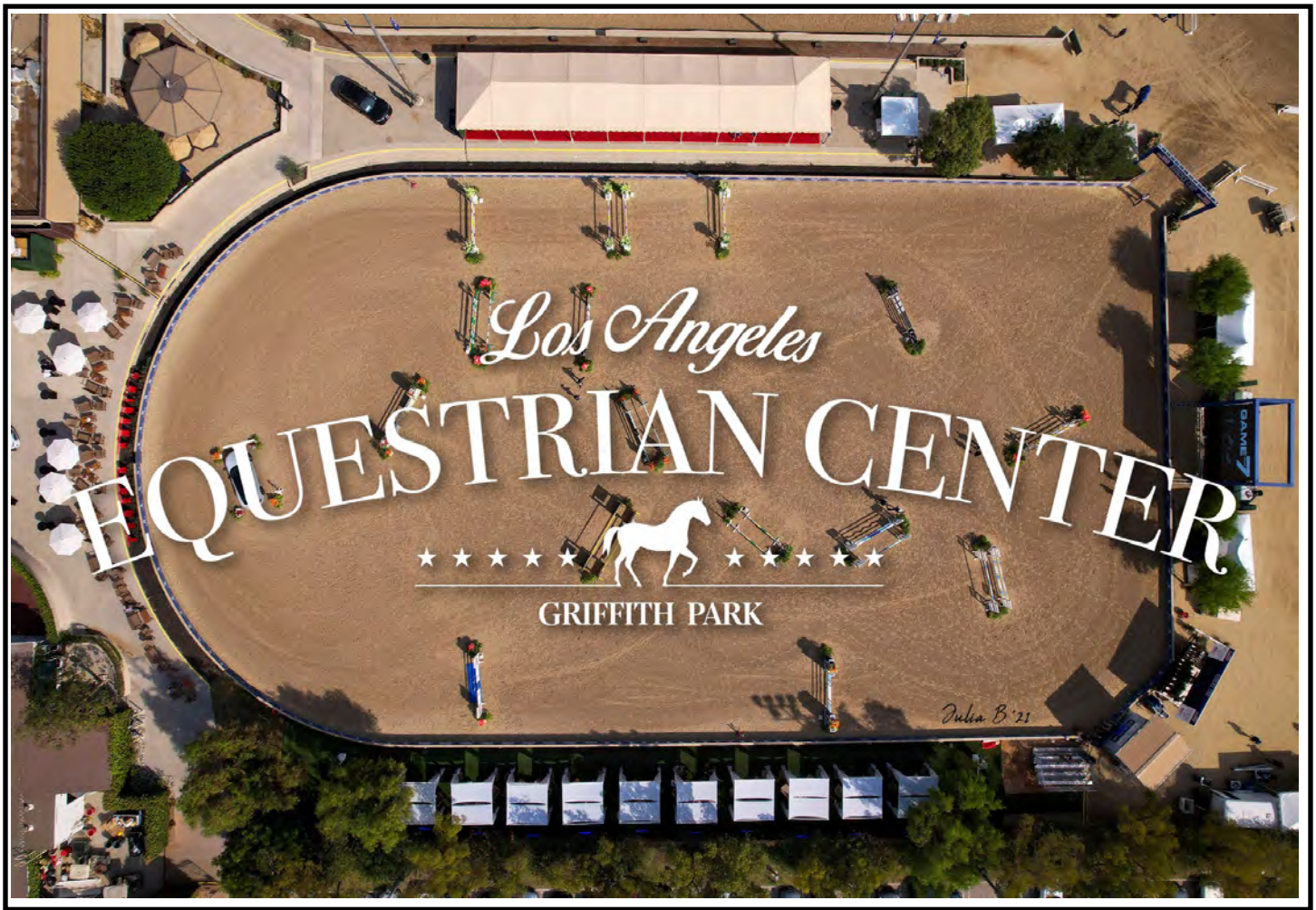

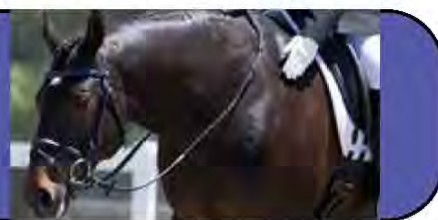

Dressage (training or schooling) is an equitation term that means the gradual harmonious development of the horse's physical and mental condition with the aim to achieve the improvement of his natural gaits and perfect understanding with his rider.
