RULES AND GENERAL INFORMATION

- 1. Cool August Nights II is covered by the rules and specifications of the current US Equestrian Rule Book and will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith.
- 2. Amateurs, Juniors & Young Riders: Amateurs are defined by the rules and specifications of the current USEF Rule Book. *If an Amateur rider is planning on competing at the CDS Championship show they will be required to have an USEF Amateur card.* Jr/ YR rider classes are offered to anyone 21 and under (may compete until the end of the calendar year in which they turn 21) Young Riders are eligible for FEI YR classes from 16-21 years of age.
- **3. CONDITIONS OF ENTRY:** Every horse entered for competition will be under the control of the Horse Show Management, but the Horse Show Management will, in no case, be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur, and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the Horse Show and its Directors harmless for any loss or accident to his horse, horses or equipment which may occur from sickness, fire or otherwise.

4. ENTRY PROCEDURES: PLEASE READ CAREFULLY!!

- A. Please submit completed and signed entry form. Include <u>all membership numbers</u>, proof of vaccinations & of Freestyle score eligibility (if entered in a freestyle) along with all fees. Documentation may be emailed to mmmdressage@gmail.com at time of entry submission if issues with online submission. Entries submitted w/out membership #'s and/or without all documentation by original close of entries will be charged a \$25 incomplete fee. <u>SEND ALL FEES OR CC_INFORMATION WITH ENTRY for non online entry.</u>
- B. Entry Acceptance: Entries will be accepted on a first come-first serve basis until classes are filled. Entries received after classes are filled will be notified and, if desired, put on a waiting list. Those on a waiting list not getting into the show will have all fees refunded. NO PHONE entries will be accepted. All entries must be made online at https://entry.foxvillage.com or typed on an official fillable entry form and filled out completely as to classes, exhibitors names, addresses, phone numbers, association numbers, and signatures. Parents or guardians must sign the official entry blank of a minor before a number will be released. Emailed entries will incur a \$12 email entry fee. Entries close and MUST BE RECEIVED BY Wednesday, August 13, 2025! NO Entry will be processed without FULL payment!!!
- **5. LATE ENTRIES**: All entries must be **RECEIVED** on or before the closing date or will be considered a late entry. Each late entry will be charged a late fee of \$75.00. Late entries will be accepted and given a ride time only as schedule permits.
- **6. SCRATCHES/REFUNDS: REFUND REQUESTS MUST BE IN WRITING AND SIGNED (EMAIL IS ACCEPTABLE).** Refunds for cancellations made prior to the entry closing date will be made in full less the office fee. No refunds will be given after the closing date for any reason, including acts of God, natural disasters, severe weather etc.

Refund of USDF Qualifying Fees: Scratches prior to show in which a full refund (less office fee) is being made WILL include any USDF Qualifying fees paid. Scratches that do NOT qualify for a full refund will NOT be refunded any USDF Qualifying Fees. Non-refunded USDF Qualifying Fees will be paid to USDF per USDF rules.

- 7. UNPAID CHARGES: Any exhibitor leaving the show with an unpaid balance of entry fees or feed bill, will be billed for these charges and a \$35.00 billing fee will be added to the total due. Until these charges are settled, all future entries of rider and owner will be returned.
- 8. RETURNED CHECKS: Checks returned by the bank or declined credit cards will be accessed a 10% penalty (minimum \$50.00)
- 9. (GR902.1): EVERY CLASS OFFERED HEREIN WHICH IS COVERED BY THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE CURRENT USEF RULEBOOK WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGED IN ACCORDANCE THEREWITH.
- 10. TESTS: The Current USEF FEI and FEI YR tests will be used.
- 11. RIDING TIMES: Preliminary ride times will be mailed and final ride times will be put on the website at www.cornerstonedressage.com by 5:00 pm the day before the show for all exhibitors Ride times will also be available at the showgrounds at 5:00 pm the day before the ride is scheduled. Adequate time intervals cannot be guaranteed when riders enter more than one horse in any class. If you enter classes in different levels or divisions ie. Open Amateur or junior, there may be a considerable time between rides. It is the responsibility of the rider to inform the management of any time conflicts at least 24 hours before the scheduled rides. Any changes after the show starts will be charged a \$15.00 office fee.



RULES AND GENERAL INFORMATION continued

- **12. ARENAS:** 20 x 60 competition arenas of composition and sand footing—warm up arena has same type footing. Lunnging has packed sand footing. Only horses entered in the show will be allowed in warm-up area. No one on foot is allowed in designated warm-ups. Lungeing is to be done ONLY in specified areas. All horses in the warm-up arenas must wear their competition numbers. All arena must be vacated while equipment is being used.
- 13. RIBBONS AND AWARDS: In classes where three or more riders complete the class, the winner will receive an award. If less than three, ribbons only will be given. Ribbons are awarded to fifth place. Ribbons/awards will not be mailed! Please pick up in office.
- 14. MANAGEMENT: Horse Show Management reserves the right to itself to interpret all questions and conditions in regard to or arising out of any incident in the show without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. All questions not covered in these rules and regulations shall be decided by the Horse Show Management; their decision will be final. The Horse Show Management reserves itself the right to refuse, accept conditionally, or to cancel any entries, disqualify riders or exhibitors, prohibit exhibition of entries and cancel award prizes, without claim to damages; to change, cancel or combine any classes, to reschedule classes after due notice to exhibitors, or to change rings or rotate judges.
- **15. FEED AND BEDDING AT LAEC:** Hay and feed orders should be made through Damoors Feed store 818-242-2841. Shavings can be Ordered on your entry or by emailing mmmdressage@gmail.com.
- 16. HOSE/ WASHING: Do not wash horses in barn area-Please use the wash racks. We recommend you have a garden hose available.
- 17. STALL CLEANING: Please deposit all manure at the far end of the barn aisles.
- **18. STABLING:** NO STRAW IS PERMITTED-ONLY SHAVINGS FOR BEDDING. NO FIRST BEDDING is provided, but may be ordered prior to the show. Stalls are of wood construction, 10' X 10" and wood with dutch doors. Stalls are \$60.00 for one overnight stay, i.e. if coming in Saturday for Saturday comp only, leaving Sunday morning = 1 overnight (\$60.00). Choose stabling for this competition only. All stalls must be vacated by 11:00 a.m. on departure day.
- **19. SCHOOLING HORSES:** Horses not entered in the show must be registered with the Horse show office and will be given a number to be worn at all times outside of the stall. Appropriate office fee, stall or ground fees, drug fees and a <u>\$65 Per show day schooling fee</u> must be paid. Any person(s) riding a schooling horse must have signed an official entry blank and/or release form. No school horses are allowed in the warm-up area during the competition. Schooling horses scratched after closing date will be charged the \$55.00 office fee.
- 20. DOGS: Dogs must be on a leash at all times, even in the Barn area. Stray dogs will be impounded and held for \$50 fine
- **21. PARKING:** Parking is allowed in designated areas only. Violators improperly parked, including NO PARKING ZONES AND FIRE LANES, will be issued citations and/or towed from premises at the vehicle owner's expense. (U.S. Mun. Code 80.71-4/ CA. Veh. Code 22658A)
- 22. RV's: \$85 per day with or without hook-ups. May be ordered on entry or mmmdressage@gmail.com
- 23. RAIN SCHEDULE: In the event of rain, times will be rescheduled to accommodate as many rides as possible. If we cancel your class, your money for that class will be refunded if you scratch a class that is rescheduled, you will be liable for all class fees.
- 24. FREESTYLES: Musical Freestyles: It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to get their music emailed to the announcer. Please include the rider/horse and class #. Send directly to Regi Toscano at barootifulart@gmail.com and a copy to the show secretary, Meaghan Mallory at mmmdressage@gmail.com. Freestyles riders may have a representative at the announcer's stand to tell the announcer when to start and stop the music. A back-up CD, MP3 or WAV file is required at the show. No cell phones or zip drives.
- 25. MEDICAL WASTE/SHARPS CONTAINERS: In accordance with the rules of USEF (GR1210.4 Bio-Hazardous Medical Waste containers are provided in the stable area. All exhibitors and their agents are responsible for the proper disposal of this waste. Competition Management may fine any individual up to \$100 for improper disposal of needles or other sharp disposable instruments.
- 26. HEADGEAR RULE: From the time horses are officially admitted to the competition grounds by competition management, anyone mounted on a horse at any time on the competition grounds including non-competing riders, riders on non-competing horses, and those competing in all classes and tests, including Para-Equestrian tests must wear protective headgear as defined by this rule and otherwise in compliance with GR801. Any rider violating this rule at any time must immediately be prohibited from further riding until such headgear is properly in place. Protective headgear is defined as a riding helmet which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. The harness must be secured and properly fitted.
- 27. BITS AND BRIDLE CHECK: NEW DEC. 1, 2023: DR126 2.i.1-1a: Exhibitors must present bridles and bits, if & when requested, to the technical delegate for inspections utilizing the method, timeframe (s), & location (s) identified by the competitions management with the agreement of the T.D. The methods must be communicated to the competitors prior to the start of the competition.

RULES AND GENERAL INFORMATION continued

28. Motorized Vehicle Statement: GR1301.7-8: Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above-described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule

29. USEF EQUINE VACCINATION RULE GR844: Note the following will be followed: At Federation licensed competitions horses, more than 7 months of age, entering the grounds must be accompanied by documentation of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) vaccinations within six months prior to entering the stables. Horses not in compliance with this rule may be required to leave the competition grounds upon request by Competition Management. Documentation should consist of one of the following methods mentioned below. The frequency of vaccine administration should be per the vaccine manufacturers' or veterinarian's recommendations. It is recommended that vaccines are administered by or under the direction of a veterinarian. In the case of vaccines administered by a veterinarian, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide documentation from the veterinarian on documenting that the horse in question received the vaccina-tions; name of the vaccines and date of vaccine administration. In the case of vaccines administered by a person other than a veterinarian, the exhibitor, upon request by Com-petition Management, must provide a receipt of the vaccine purchase which is signed by the owner, or agent with care, custody, and control of the horse; name, serial number and expiration date of the vaccine; and date of vaccine administration. In the case of a horse that is unable to receive either of the vaccinations due to a history of adverse reactions, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide a letter from the veterinarian on official letter-head stating that the horse in question cannot be vaccinated due to medical concerns and a log of temperatures taken twice daily for the seven days prior to entering the competition grounds. These horses must also have their temperature taken and logged twice daily while on the competition grounds. The log of temperatures should be provided to the Competition Management, steward, or technical delegate when requested.


35 COMPETITON: ALL HORSES STABLED ON THE SHOW GROUNDS AND HAUL INS—ARE REQUIRED TO HAVE THEIR TEMPERATURES TAKEN TWICE A DAY!. This is mandatory. A temp log has been provided in the prize list and will be available in the rider packet at check in. It must be posted on your stall/trailer and you MUST temp your horses twice per day—1 time in the AM and 1 time in the PM. BRING YOUR OWN THERMOMETER—as temps must be taken—those not adhering to the stipulation will be asked to leave the competition. Febrile horses (temperatures >101.5) or horses showing any clinical signs of illness must be reported immediately to show management/veterinarian.

CDS Horse of the Year Championships Qualifying Requirements

CDS / USDF CHAMPIONSHIPS SEPTEMBER 18-21, 2025

Murieta Equestrian Center, Rancho Murieta, CA Last day to qualify August 25, 2025

CDS will require a \$25 nomination fee PER HORSE/RIDER COMBINATION - for CDS Championship classes. Nomination fees can be paid at any time during the show season but must be paid before the closing date.

- OPEN Horse of the Year classes will consist of ONE RIDE of the highest level, judged by two judges
- CDS Overall Adult Amateur Championship Classes

Amateur riders will compete in two classes to determine the CDS Overall Adult Amateur Champion in Training – Fourth Level. The first test will be awarded ribbons 1st – 10th. The second test will be awarded ribbons 1st – 10th.

The CDS Overall Adult Amateur Championship will be determined by combining the percentage of the two tests. The top three Riders of the combine tests will come back for honor rounds. In case of a tie for the AA Overall Championship the rider with the highest percentage in the second test will determine the winner. Prize Money will be divided 1st - 30%, 2nd - 25%, 3rd - 20%, 4th - 15%, 5th - 10%.

CDS JR/YR Overall Champion

JR/YR riders will compete in two classes to determine the CDS Overall Junior/Young Rider Champion in Training – Fourth Level. The first test will be awarded ribbons 1st – 10th. The second test will be awarded ribbons 1st – 10th. The top three riders in the combined tests will come back for honor rounds and be name the Overall Junior/Young Rider Champion. The First place winner will receive the Champion rider jacket. The top three of the combine tests will come back for honor rounds. No prize money is awarded in the for the CDS JR/YR Championships classes. In case of a tie for the Overall Junior/Young Rider Championship the rider with the highest percentage in the second test will determine the winner.

Three divisions are offered at the CDS Annual Show: Open and Adult Amateur at Training through Grand Prix Levels and JR/YR Divisions at Training through PSG. Competitors under the age of 22 are eligible for the JRYR divisions. Freestyle classes are open divisions.

Lower-Level Freestyle Champion. The Lower - Level Freestyle Champion will be determined by the top 5 scoring horses in the Freestyle classes 1st — 4th level. The Highest scoring horse/rider will be named Lower-Level Freestyle Champion and will receive the Champion jacket and prize money. Reserve Champion will receive prize money. 3rd - 5th place will receive prize money. All Freestyle classes 1st — 4th Level will receive their own set of ribbons 1st — 6th.

- Open Division: Open to all qualified competitors.
- Adult Amateur Division: Open to qualified competitors holding an US Equestrian Amateur card who are 22 years of age and older.
- Junior Young Rider Division: Open to competitors under 22 years of age.
