RULES AND INFORMATION

1. Cornerstone Dressage Shows and every class offered herein are covered by the rules and specifications of the current USEF Rule Book and the CDS Standing Rules and will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith.
2. ENTRY PROCEDURE: It is preferred that entries be submitted online at <https://entry.foxvillage.com/>. Paper entries will be accepted but they must be made on the entry form in this prize list and must be filled out completely, including all classes entered, all signatures, organization membership numbers and fees. Make copies of both sides if you need more than one entry form. Only one horse/rider combination per entry form. Only the entry agreement in this prize list will be accepted. The USEF entry agreement WILL NOT be accepted. Review paragraphs 25b and 25c below. Parents or guardians must sign the entry agreement of a minor.

3. MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENTS: CDS Members in good standing shall be eligible to participate as riders and owners. A non-member may also participate upon payment of a \$25 CDS non-member fee. All participants must be a CDS member or pay the non-member fee. Scores earned by non-members will not count toward CDS awards or qualification for CDS Championships, Regional Adult Amateur Competitions or Junior Championships. WDAA encourages Western Dressage riders to provide their membership number and their horses ID number.
4. PROOF OF VACCINATION: Proof of vaccination for Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) on or after February 23, 2026 is required for all horses. Proof of vaccination must be on 1) the US Equestrian Vaccination Record (available at <https://www.usef.org/forms-pubs/xUbu-pT8eLM/equine-vaccination-record>), 2) the vaccination record from the horse's passport or 3) a complete copy of a report from the administering veterinarian may be provided, if it includes the name of the veterinarian, the name of the horse (the name on the entry), the name and lot number of the vaccination and the date administered. See the USEF Rulebook (GR845) for the specific requirements. Please bring the original records to the show in case there are questions. Horses not in compliance with this rule may be required to leave the competition grounds upon request by Competition Management.
5. Entries are accepted on a first-come, first-served basis until classes are filled. All entries received after the closing date will be accepted only if the schedule permits. Each late entry shall be assessed a late fee of \$35.00. Any entry changed after the closing date will be accommodated at Horse Show Management's sole and absolute discretion and will incur a \$20.00 change fee. Riders will ride with their classes, unless riding multiple horses, in accordance with Federation rules. Each competitor is responsible for supplying Horse Show Management with Rider's full name and CDS number; Horse's name; Owner's full name and CDS number; Trainer's full name; Coach's full name (if applicable) & copies of each applicable membership card, BEFORE the day of competition. The scores of competitors who fail to supply correct numbers may not be counted toward qualification for the CDS Finals (see CDS Omnibus).
6. CONDITION OF ENTRY: Every horse entered for competition will be under the control of the Horse Show Management, but the Horse Show Management will, in no case, be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur, and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the Horse Show; its Directors and Employees, and Cornerstone Dressage; its Directors and Employees, harmless for any loss or accident, to his horse, horses or equipment which may occur from accident, sickness, fire or otherwise.

7. CLOSING OF ENTRIES: All entries close at midnight (Pacific Time Zone) on August 14, 2026, (the "Closing Date"). Entries are accepted on a first-come, first-served basis until classes are filled. Mail-in entries must be received on or before the closing date. Electronic entries must be received not later than midnight on the closing date. All entries received after the closing date will be considered late entries and will be accepted only if the schedule permits. Each late entry shall be assessed a late fee of \$35.00.
8. WAIT LISTED ENTRIES: Management reserves the right to stop accepting entries if the show fills before the published closing date. Entries received after that date will continue to be accepted, if the competitor desires to be wait listed. Entries placed in a wait list status will be prioritized based upon date and time of receipt. Any entrant whose entry is placed in a wait list status will be contacted by the Show Secretary via email or phone. In the event that an entrant scratches his/her entry, wait listed entrants will be contacted. Any wait listed entrant that refuses to move to an active entry status will be removed from the wait list and the next wait listed entrant will be contacted.
9. REFUSAL OF ENTRIES: Horse Show Management reserves the right to refuse, accept conditionally, or cancel any entries of any exhibitors.
10. REFUNDS, CHANGES AND SCRATCHES: Scratches made prior to the closing date will receive a refund, less the office fee. It is the rider's, owner's or trainer's responsibility to inform the Show Secretary via email, text or telephone call of their intention to scratch. Absolutely no refunds for scratches after the Closing Date. Class changes or additions after the closing date will incur a \$20.00 change fee and will be made only at the discretion of Horse Show Management. Scratches made after check-in at the show must be made in writing on Scratched Ride Form at least two rides before the scheduled ride time so that the judge may be notified. Scratches made ringside will be considered a No Show and may result in automatic scratch from any remaining rides for the day (see DR126.2.b.3).
11. RETURNED CHECKS: Checks returned by the bank for any reason will be charged an additional 10% penalty (\$25.00 minimum). Accounts will be given ten (10) calendar days to be paid in full with cash or cash equivalent or they will be turned into CDS for further disciplinary action.
12. RESPONSIBILITY: All owners will be held responsible for any damage incurred by them, and their agents or employees, to buildings and other properties on the show grounds, and shall be handled accordingly.
13. DISCIPLINE: Exhibitors are warned that any act of discourtesy or disobedience to the officials of this show by the owner, exhibitor, agent, lessee, trainer, coach, groom, rider, handler or family of the above, will result in disqualification of the horse from the show. The Horse Show Management reserves the right to remove a horse, owner, exhibitor, agent, lessee, trainer, coach, groom, rider or handler from the show without being liable for compensation or damages.
14. MANAGEMENT: The Horse Show Management reserves the right to interpret all questions and conditions with regard to or arising out of incident at the show without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. All questions not covered in these rules and regulations shall be decided by the Horse Show Management, with their decision to be final. The Horse Show Management reserves to itself the right to: refuse, accept conditionally or cancel any entries, disqualify riders or exhibitors, prohibit entries and cancel award prizes without claim for damages, cancel or combine any classes, reschedule classes and rotate judges in order to facilitate the time schedule.
15. CANCELLATION: In the event of rain or inclement weather prior to the show, it is the competitor's responsibility to call the Horse Show Management to determine whether the show is canceled. Shows are not canceled due to rain unless footing is deemed unsafe. If this show is canceled for any reason, a \$40.00 per day fee

will be retained from each entry fee.

16. SHOW OFFICE: Exhibitors are encouraged to check-in promptly upon first arrival on the show grounds. The show office will open approximately 2 hours before the start of the show and until approximately 1 hour after the last ride of the day.
17. TESTS: Current USDF, USEF and WDAA tests will be used. FEI and Musical Freestyle tests are offered.
18. SCORED TESTS will only be distributed to riders, or their authorized representatives, after the results have been finalized for the class and the awards presented. The winner of each class is the competitor having the highest total points. Ties will be broken as stated in the USEF Rulebook (DR123.3 or WD127.3).
19. READING TESTS: Reading tests is acceptable at our shows as stated in the USEF Rulebook (DR122.1 and WD126.1). Readers should be a MINIMUM of 6 feet away from any perimeter of the dressage court. Readers may stand near "E" or "B," but if two courts are present then the reader should stand OUTSIDE the fence as to be at least 6 feet away from the perimeter of the court.
20. NUMBER OF TESTS: Horses may compete in no more than one Recognized Competition on the same day(s) and are limited to a maximum of three Dressage rides per day at Fourth Level and below or two Dressage rides per day above Fourth Level. Western Dressage horses may enter a maximum of three classes from Introductory through Level 5 and a horse/rider combination may enter no more than two consecutive levels. Horses entered in both Dressage and Western Dressage classes may enter no more than three classes. Dressage Seat Equitation is excluded from the maximum limit of rides per day and horses in these classes may compete at any level for which they are otherwise eligible during the same competition.
21. RIDE TIMES: Preliminary ride times will be distributed to all riders, owners, trainers and coaches via email by 6PM on Wednesday before the show. Final ride times will be available on FoxVillage (<https://foxvillage.com/>) by the Thursday of the week of the show. Please call Show Management for times if you are unable to access the website. Ride times will also be posted on the show grounds at the show office during the show. Be sure to check your times at the show office on the morning of the show to make sure nothing has changed.
22. RIBBONS & AWARDS: Ribbons are given first to fifth place for each division (Open, Adult Amateur and Junior/Young Rider).
23. JUDGES: If for any reason a judge fails to attend the show or to perform his duties, the Horse Show Management reserves the right to substitute a judge of the same or higher rating for one who was officially designated in the Premium.
24. JUNIORS: All minors/juniors must be supervised by their parent/guardian or authorized agent while at or on the show grounds, whether riding or on foot. The parent/guardian or authorized agent shall assume all responsibility to protect juniors from any injury, damage, harm and/or loss and shall identify, defend and hold CDS, USDF, USEF and Horse Show Management harmless there from. All juniors must wear properly fitted protective headgear (ASTM/SEI) while riding anywhere on the showgrounds. The harness must be secured and properly fitted. It is the responsibility of the rider, or the parent or guardian of the junior exhibitor, to see to it that the headgear worn complies with appropriate safety standards for protective headgear intended for equestrian use and is properly fitted and in good condition. Horse Show Management and licensed officials are not responsible for checking headgear worn for such compliance. CDS, USDF, USEF makes no representation or warranty, express or implied, that any protective headgear and cautions riders that death or serious injury may result despite wearing such headgear as all equestrian sports involved inherent dangerous risk and as such no helmet can protect against all foreseeable injuries.

25. DEFINITIONS

a. JUNIOR / YOUNG RIDERS and ADULT AMATEUR: Individuals are eligible as Juniors until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 18. Individuals are eligible as Young Riders from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 16 until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 21. Competitors shall compete as adults from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 22. You must specify on the entry which section you are entered in A (Am) or J (Junior)/Young Rider (YR). Riders claiming amateur status must have a USEF Amateur Card.

b. TRAINER: Any adult, or adults who has the responsibility for the care, training, custody, or performance of a horse. See USEF Rulebook, GR148a.

c. COACH: Any adult or adults on the competition grounds who has or shares the responsibility for instructing, teaching, schooling, or advising a rider, driver, handler, or vaulter in equestrian skills. See USEF Rulebook, GR108.

26. DISPENSATION/CLASSIFICATION CERTIFICATE: All entries into any 100-series class wishing to use approved compensatory aids must provide a copy of their Dispensation/Classification Certificate from the USEF Adaptive Sports Committee (see DR119.12-119.14). The Dispensation/Classification Certificate will list all compensatory aids and adaptive equipment allowed the individual while competing. Other compensatory aids or special equipment not specifically listed on the Dispensation/Classification Certificate are not allowed. A copy of the Dispensation/Classification Certificate must be included with the individual's entry. The show secretary will include a copy attached to all applicable scoring sheets for the judge's reference. For instructions on how to apply for the Dispensation Certificate, please refer to USEF Rule GR1312.

27. UNRATED CLASSES: CDS only recognized shows may offer unrated classes including but not limited to USDF Intro tests, USEA Eventing tests, Western Dressage tests, Leadline classes, Training aid classes, Prix Caprilli tests. The mandatory helmet rule shall apply. Riders and horse owners in unrated classes at CDS only recognized shows must 1) be a member of CDS or 2) pay the non-member fee and complete the CDS non-member information form.

28. DRESSAGE SEAT EQUITATION: This is a rail class. Multiple horses/riders will be in the ring together. See DR133. Riders age 19 to 21 will ride in the Adult Amateur class.

29. FREESTYLE MUSIC: It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to get their music emailed to the announcer. Please include the rider/horse and class #. Send directly to Regi Toscano at barootifulart@gmail.com and a copy to the show secretary, Eric Grimm at grimmericb@gmail.com. Freestyles riders may have a representative at the announcer's stand to tell the announcer when to start and stop the music. A back-up CD, MP3 or WAV file is required at the show. No cell phones or zip drives.

30. TEST OF CHOICE CLASSES: Horse/rider combinations may enter each Test of Choice class once..

31. STABLING: Stalls are of wood construction, 10' X 10', with Dutch doors. Stalls are \$100 Friday night through Saturday. Day stalls (Saturday only) are \$75. All horses must leave the show grounds by Saturday evening. In an emergency, please call Glenda McElroy at (818) 679-1570 to make special arrangements. NO STRAW IS PERMITTED; SHAVINGS ONLY FOR BEDDING. No first bedding is provided. Call (818) 841-3554 to order shavings.

32. SHARPS CONTAINER LOCATION: The sharps container will be located in the show office.

33. **ARENA DIMENSIONS AND FOOTING:** Show arena is 20 m x 60 m. A warm-up arena of at least 150 ft x 80 ft is provided. Footing consists of mainly sand and DG in the show arena and in the warm-up arena. Only those horses entered in the show are permitted use of the show facilities, warm-up arena and show area. All horses on the show grounds must wear competition numbers. No lunging in the warm-up arena.
34. **DOGS:** Dogs must be on a leash at all times, even in the Barn area. Stray dogs will be impounded and held for \$50 fine.
35. **PARKING:** Parking is allowed in designated areas only. Violators improperly parked, including **NO PARKING ZONES AND FIRE LANES**, will be issued citations and/or towed from premises at the vehicle owner's expense. (U.S. Mun. Code - 80.71-4/ CA. Veh. Code 22658A).
36. **CDS HIGH SCORE PONY AWARD:** The high scoring pony at Training - Grand Prix (Freestyles, Walk Trot excluded) at each CDS recognized show will receive a High Score Pony Ribbon. To be eligible, all ponies must have a current USEF DRESSAGE Pony Measurement Card. If the pony is measured at a show and receives a temporary show measurement, that measurement will be good for all CDS shows during that show season. CDS also offers a Year End Award to the Highest Scoring Pony in Open, Amateur and Junior Divisions. If interested in participating in this program, please include a copy of the pony's USEF Dressage Pony Measurement Card.
37. **CDS HIGH SCORE PARA RIDER AWARD:** The high scoring para rider at all levels and tests (all 100-, 200- and 300-series tests, plus classes 518 and 519), excluding freestyles, will receive a High Score Para Rider Ribbon from CDS. To be eligible, riders must be members of CDS and provide a copy of their Dispensation/Classification Certificate.

If not specified as Open (O), Adult Amateur (AA) or Junior/Young Rider (JR/YR) on the entry form, you will be entered in the OPEN division.

PROTECTIVE HEADGEAR

From the time horses are officially admitted to the competition grounds by competition management, anyone mounted on a horse at any time on the competition grounds, including non-competing riders, riders on non-competing horses, and those competing in all classes and tests, including Para-Equestrian tests, must wear protective headgear as defined by this rule and otherwise in compliance with GR801. Any rider violating this rule at any time must immediately be prohibited from further riding until such headgear is properly in place. Protective headgear is defined as a riding helmet which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. The harness must be secured and properly fitted.

WDAA Horse Lifetime Points & Awards Program

The WDAA Horse Lifetime Points & Awards program tracks points achieved by a horse throughout their Western Dressage career.

Points must be earned at WDAA recognized shows.

Open to all horses, ponies and mules regardless of breed, type, age, etc.

Points may be earned with more than one rider.

Owners and persons participating and/or riding a horse in the program must be current WDAA members in good standing.

Points awarded at all WD levels and Freestyle test, as well as for rail classes.

WDAA World Championship Show test/classes earn triple points.

Owner/agent/participant agrees that show management is NOT providing stabling, for the convenience of the participant and that management, the sponsoring organizations and the facility shall have no responsibility whatsoever for any injury, loss, damage, etc., as a result of using said stabling. Owner/agent/participant agrees to indemnify, defend, and hold all sponsoring and recognizing organizations, show management, their officials, officers, directors, employees, agents, personnel, volunteers harmless from any loss, damage or claims as a result of said use. Owner/agent/participant assumes all care, custody, and control with regard to this use. Owner/agent/participant agrees that every horse entered or which they bring to the show grounds will be subject to the rules of the horse show management but that neither the horse show management nor any sponsoring organization will, in any case, be responsible for damages as a result of any loss, damage or claim that may occur. They agree to defend, indemnify and hold the horse show facility, horse show management, their directors, officers, officials and/or volunteers and affiliated organizations harmless therefrom. I hereby agree to release, indemnify and hold harmless The California Dressage Society, officers, directors, agents and volunteers from and against any and all loss, liability or damage arising from or because of, or in connection with, participation in this competition or related activities. I also hereby agree to release, indemnify and hold harmless the show management, show committee and members, officers, directors, agents, and volunteers from and against any and all loss, liability or damage arising from or because of, or in connection with, participation in this competition.

ENTRY AGREEMENT

I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation. I AGREE that I choose to participate voluntarily in the Competition with my horse, as a rider, driver, handler, vaulteur, longeur, lessee, owner, agent, coach, trainer, or as parent or guardian of a junior exhibitor. I am fully aware and acknowledge that horse sports and the Competition involve inherent dangerous risks of accident, loss, and serious bodily injury including broken bones, head injuries, trauma, pain, suffering, or death ("Harm").

I AGREE to release the Federation and the Competition from all claims for money damages or otherwise for any Harm to me or my horse and for any Harm caused by me or my horse to others, even if the Harm resulted, directly or indirectly, from the negligence of the Federation or the Competition.

I AGREE to expressly assume all risks of Harm to me or my horse, including Harm resulting from the negligence of the Federation or the Competition.
